₩ABIT/AMERICORPS VALUABLE PARTNERSHIP IN PERIL

The federal government's

AmeriCorps agency started funding a partnership with Habitat for Humanity in 1994. This partnership connects individuals with affiliates of Habitat who want to aid in tackling community issues within the mission of providing affordable housing. Since this partnership started. 12,000 members have served in Habitat AmeriCorps positions and have helped engage 4.5 million volunteers. During 2024, Habitat AmeriCorps' 321 members were located

in 34 states, engaging 83,000 volunteers while supporting 836 housing projects.

Currently, there are eleven (11)**AmeriCorps** members working with affiliates of Habitat for Humanity in Oregon. Most of these members are either serving in Portland or Bend, but Newberg Area Habitat for Humanity was fortunate to secure an AmeriCorps member in early 2025. In Oregon, Habitat these **AmeriCorps** members have completed eight (8) repair projects, eight (8) new build projects. and are currently repairing one (1) additional project

and constructing seven (7) new building projects. AmeriCorps only partners with non-profit organizations, and its members desire to work in service-focused



roles. In other words, the Habitat AmeriCorps partnership provides members with hands-on experience while they work in local communities. In exchange, Habitat harnesses the energy of AmeriCorps members at a reduced cost to further the organization's mission.

At the beginning of January 2025, Newberg Area Habitat for Humanity (NAHFH) added a Community Outreach Coordinator position and brought on William Troyer through Habitat AmeriCorps. The job was added as part of the affiliate's Three-Year

Strategic Plan. The goal of building four homes per year by 2026 would not be feasible without having William within the office dedicated to marketing, outreach, and recruiting volunteers. Habitat AmeriCorps pays a monthly living allowance to the member equal to \$18,700 over the 10 ½ month contract period. NAHFH was able to bring on William for a nominal \$1130 monthly fee paid to Habitat AmeriCorps. Small stipends totaling \$300/month for groceries and housing are part of the benefit package as well, but the main goal of these members is community The remainder of the service. member's living allowance, plus costs related to the coordination of AmeriCorps members. comes from an AmeriCorps grant Habitat for Humanity International.

Like other AmeriCorps members, William graduated with a four-year college degree. He, like other AmeriCorps members, wants to use his skills to improve the lives of citizens within a community and has a passion for civic engagement. His interest is to serve his country through direct service. William voiced those reasons for applying and starting

With all the recent federal cuts, **AmeriCorps** and partnership with Habitat are facing an uncertain future. As of the middle of April, 15% of the 500 employees in the national office lost their jobs. During the weekend of April 26-27, over 1000 organizations across the country received notices of termination of their AmeriCorps grants effective immediately, however, Habitat AmeriCorps was spared at that time. Local Habitat AmeriCorps members reach out to their Engagement **AmeriCorps** Specialist on a regular basis for guidance and advice. Currently,

there are only three specialists who coordinate with all VISTA (Volunteers In Service to America) and National members throughout the United States. With such drastic cuts, there will be ripple effects through the Habitat AmeriCorps partnership.

It is vital that AmeriCorps members have the opportunity to

continue to contribute to communities nationally. You can show support by contacting either Senator Ron Wyden, Senator Jeff Merkley, or Representative Andrea Salinas (www.senate.gov or www.house.gov).
